CONSIDER A LOVING EARTHLY FATHER WITH HIS OWN CHILD



Does he expect his child to be obedient?

What does that look like?

Does obedience imply perfection?

If not perfection, then what?

HOW CAN I EARN SALVATION?

I can't! That's the wrong question.

None of us will be saved because we deserve it.

If I am saved, it is NOT because of who I am, but because of who HE is.

"for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith." (Romans 3:23-25, ESV)



IF THE ONLY WAY I CAN BE JUSTIFIED IS BY THE GIFT OF HIS GRACE, HOW DO I KNOW IF GOD FINDS ME WORTHY OF THAT GIFT?

I WILL NEVER BE WORTHY OF THE GIFT OF HIS GRACE! MY SALVATION IS NOT BECAUSE OF WHO I AM, BUT BECAUSE OF WHO HE IS.

TWO IMPERFECT MEN

DAVID

He is called a "man after God's own heart". (1 Samuel 13:14)

David, Bathsheba, and Uriah (2 Samuel 11)

David was clearly not perfect.

His response (2 Samuel 12)

PAUL

"For I know that nothing good dwells in me, that is, in my flesh. For I have the desire to do what is right, but not the ability to carry it out. For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing." (Romans 7:18-19, ESV)

"I don't mean that I am exactly what God wants me to be. I have not yet reached that goal. But I continue trying to reach it and make it mine. That's what Christ Jesus wants me to do. It is the reason he made me his." (Philippians 3:12, ERV)

I KNOW I'M NOT GOOD ENOUGH, AND I KNOW GOD'S GIFT OF GRACE IS MY ONLY HOPE, BUT I'M STILL NOT CONFIDENT. HOW CAN I BE SURE I AM SAVED? CONCLUSION

I am not saved because of my ability to do all of the right things and to not do all of the wrong things. Rather, I am saved because God loves me, gave Himself for me by sending Jesus to pay the price for my sin, and freely gives me His gift of grace because He wants me to be with Him.

Accepting this truth gives me a great sense of peace and causes a shift in my focus. No longer do I live my life in fear that I am not really saved because I stumble from time to time and am unworthy of God's gift. Instead, I focus on God's love for me and I am at peace because I know that God knows my heart, understands my inner struggles, and saves me even though I am unworthy.

This peace, which surpasses all understanding (Philippians 4:7), leads me to serve my Lord no longer out of fear, but because I love Him and want to please him. It becomes my natural response to his love for me. It is the only response that makes any sense.
